DRAWING SERIES





CHARCOAL DRAWING

This programme introduces the art of Charcoal Drawing, a medium that are often used for versatile properties such as the rough texture that leaves marks less permanent than other art media. It can produce lines that are very light or intensely black while being easily removable and vulnerable to leave stains on paper. The dry medium can be applied to almost any surface from smooth to a very coarse. Fixatives are used with charcoal drawings to prevent erasing or rubbing off of charcoal dusts.

At the end of this programme, participants will develop an understanding of the characteristics of the medium. Participants will be able to apply techniques such as drawing, shading and erasing to create an art piece in exploration of the medium.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Charcoal Drawing and develop a new skill set to further create more interesting art pieces.

At the end of this programme, participants will learn about the fundamental elements and principles of art and design in order to develop an understanding towards perspective of the subject matter. Participants will also learn to understand the use of different pencil lead to describe and identify the source of light around the subject matter.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Still Life Drawing and cultivate patience through this art form. Participants will realise the differences between drawing base on their imagination and what they see are two separate outcomes.

At the end of this programme, participants will develop an understanding of the characteristics of the medium. Participants will be able to handle the medium confidently and apply techniques taught.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Oil Pastels and discover new methods of creating textures and developing them into their own style to create one of a kind art pieces.

At the end of this programme, participants will develop an enticing interest and understanding for this art form. Participants will be enticed to create more art pieces with techniques taught and continue to be amazed at the end of each piece of artwork.

MANGA DRAWING

FOR UPPER PRIMARY AND SECONDARY LEVEL

This programme introduces the art of Manga Drawing, comics that are created in Japan or by creators in the Japanese Language developed in the late 19th century. The word Manga is a Japanese word that refers to both comics and cartooning.

At the end of this programme, participants will be brought through a step by step approach of understanding the different facial expressions and body proportions to create and personalise their own Manga character.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Manga Drawing and be able to stylised their own personal character created from scratch.

CHALK PASTEL DRAWING

This programme introduces the art of Chalk Pastel Drawing, a medium where pigments are mixed with a binder that allows for layering and blending vibrant colours to create a soft finishing look. It can produce textures that are very light or intensely dark while being easily removable and vulnerable to leave stains on paper. Fixatives are used with chalk pastel drawings to prevent erasing or rubbing off of pastel dusts.

At the end of this programme, participants will develop an understanding of the characteristics of the medium. Participants will be able to apply techniques such as drawing, shading, mixing and blending of colours to create an art piece in exploration of the medium.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Chalk Pastel Drawing to further develop and explore new methods of using the medium to create more interesting art pieces.

ACRYLIC PAINTING

This programme introduces the art of Acrylic Painting, a medium that dries fast and becomes water resistant when dry. Acrylic finishing can resemble to a watercolour or an oil painting depending on how much the paint is diluted with water thus having its own unique characteristics.

At the end of this programme, participants will learn and understand the characteristics of the paint to create different brush strokes of textures. Participants will also learn about the fundamental elements and principles of art and design in order to develop an understanding towards perspective of the subject matter.

BATIK PAINTING

NAC-AEP

This programme introduces the art of Batik Painting, a wax resist dyeing technique applied to fabric commonly. Participants will be working on one of the following types of wax resist methods:

- Wax Resist Style with Hot Wax Method (NAC-AEP for secondary level)
- Wax Resist Style with Dry Wax Method (NAC-AEP for primary and lower secondary level)
- Wax Resist Style with Cold Wax Method (suitable for upper primary and secondary level only)

Hot Wax Batik Painting is the traditional form of wax resist dyeing technique which requires the use of hot boiling wax to draw dots and lines with a spouted tool called tjanting. It is therefore suitable for upper primary and secondary level.

Dry Wax Batik Painting uses a simple material of candle wax as a resistant in this method. Making this art form a great level of exposure for participants who are just getting to know about this wax resist technique.

Cold Wax Batik Painting is similar to hot wax batik painting however safer than hot wax technique. Therefore making this method suitable for younger participants to have a similar experience to the traditional technique of hot wax.

At the end of this programme, participants will delve into the historical background as well as its local pioneering batik artists. As well as developing an understanding of the repeated processes of inking and resisting, rendering from candle wax, cold wax or the usage of the tjanting to create Batik art pieces.

PRINTMAKING

This programme introduces the art of Printmaking, where it is the process of making artworks by printing on paper. Participants will be working on one of the following types of printmaking methods:

- 1. Styrofoam
- 2. String Line
- 3. Linoleum (suitable for secondary level only)
- 4. Wood Block (suitable for secondary level only)

Styrofoam and String Line printing is a fun way of exposing participants who are getting to know all about print making. Styrofoam printmaking requires a simple tool such as a stick to engrave their design onto, and creating a print after. String Line printmaking requires participants to paste a continuous string along their design to create a print. At the end of this programme, participants will learn about creating prints with simple tools and materials to achieve a print of their design. This programme is suitable for participants of all ages.

Linoleum and Woodblock printing is one of the oldest form of printmaking method. At the end of this programme, participants will learn and understand the use of different tools and its purpose of creating different types of textures for printing. While being exposed to the use of sharp carving tools, participants will also learn to be aware of the safety towards self and their peers. This programme is suitable for secondary level only.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Printmaking and discover new types of tools and methods to create their own style of prints.

WIRE IN MOTION

NAC-AEP

UPPER PRIMARY AND LOWER SECONDARY LEVEL

This programme introduces the art of Wire Sculpting, a medium that is use to create a 3-dimensional sculpture that is often used for displays. Due to its unique form, the finishing of the sculpture would appear an as abstract piece of artwork.

At the end of this programme, participants will be taught through a step-by-step process of creating a 3-dimensional sculpture while applying basic wire sculpting techniques demonstrated. Participants will get to work with either aluminium or galvanised wires to create their sculpture.

UPPER PRIMARY AND SECONDARY LEVEL

This programme introduces the art of Paper Clay, a medium that is versatile, user friendly, water based modelling media that can be suitable in creating a sculpture or decorative art work. Paint work is done once the clay is left to air dry and solidify.

At the end of this programme, participants will learn the differences between paper clay and ceramic. They will develop an understanding of the possibilities for paper clay to model the appearance of ceramic finishing except the only difference is that the medium is air dried and painted over.

This programme introduces the art of Faux Stained Glass Painting, where glass is replaced with other materials to replicate a similar effect to the original stained glass painting. Participants will be working on one of the following types of faux stained glass painting methods:

- On Transparency
- On Clear Acrylic (suitable for Upper Primary and Secondary levels only)

Faux stained glass painting on transparency is suitable for participants of all ages where coloured markers are used to achieve a similar effect of the original. Faux stained glass painting on clear acrylic requires participants to use candy tone paint to replicate close enough to an original stained glass work.

At the end of this programme, participants will learn about the history of stained glass painting and be able to identify the art form around them.

At the end of this programme, participants will have a hands on experience from start to finish on the process of the art form. Participants can expect to create objects such as bowls, bottles or sculptures from recycled materials.

At the end of this programme, participants will learn simple hand moulding skills to mix the clay colours to achieve desired colours, mould and pinch the clay into desired shapes and forms to create vibrant art works of their choice.

Participants will be exposed to the breaking of tiles to arranging the placement of tiles and pasting to create colourful and lasting artistic impression.

At the end of this programme, participants will have a hands on experience on learning the process from start to finish on completing a piece of paper cutting work. Participants will be exposed to tools and materials to aid them in achieving desired outcomes.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the art of Contemporary Paper Cutting and to be further intrigued by the art form to develop and explore new materials and ideas.

At the end of this programme, participants will learn this art form is not meant only for girls and will be introduced to some famous male designers for inspiration. Participants will also understand the purposes and advantages of making homemade jewelry design to fit and customised in terms of colours and design.

LEATHER CRAFT

This programme introduces the art of Leather Craft, a craft of making leather into functional craft objects using basic shaping techniques, sewing methods and tools to achieve desired outcomes.

At the end of this programme, participants will either use chrome-tanned leather or PVC leather to handcraft their own leather phone pouch and complement it with a set of card holder and key ring. Alternatively, participants may use the pouch as a wallet for notes and cards.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the art form, participants will also learn to appreciate the craft and be inspired to become artisans or even become an entrepreneur of this particular craft.

PRECIOUS METAL CLAY (PMC) JEWELRY

This programme introduces the art of Metal Clay Jewelry, a medium consisting of very small particles of metal such as silver mixed with a binder and water for use to create jewelry pieces. Metal clay can be shaped just like any soft clay by hand or a mold. Once dried, the piece is being fired in a kiln or a handheld gas torch that burns

away the binder leaving the piece as close to 99.9% silver.

At the end of this programme, participants will be taught how to design a leaf brooch, pendant and a ring. Through the process, participants will have a hands on experience on creating jewelry from their very own designs PMC clay.

In addition to the learning outcomes through the craft, participants will also learn to appreciate the concept of PMC and jewelry pieces they have designed and made from scratch. The craft hopes to inspire participants to become artisans or even become an entrepreneur of this particular craft.

POTTERY

This programme introduces to the art of Pottery, a ceramic material which makes up pottery wares of earthenware. Pottery is made by forming a clay body into objects of a required shape and heating them to high temperatures in a kiln which removes all the water from the clay. This induces a permanent change of strengthening and hardening of the clay and settling their shape.

At the end of this programme, participants will be taught on the use of the banding wheel to create beautiful pottery wares. Participants will have a full hands on experience on learning to design and to go through the process of completing a piece of pottery ware.
